## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **What are the dates?**

June 6<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> (Monday – Friday)

### **What students are eligible?**

**High School:** Students currently in grades 8-12 [2021-22 school year]

**Middle School:** Students currently in grades 5-7 [2021-22 school year]

Students are encouraged to invite friends.

### **Where is Camp located?**

### **What are the COVID guidelines?**

Our Discovery Church team will establish an environment that complies with the State of Florida and CDC guidelines. Registered nurses will be on site to assist with any health-related situations.

### **What will students experience?**

Water inflatables, Pool, Basketball, Dodgeball, Beach Volleyball, 9-Square, Gaga Ball, Kayaking, Disc Golf, indoor crafts, Sunrise Worship (optional), Team Games and Team Building, Powerful teaching from God's Word, Authentic Worship, Small Groups and more!

### **What are Field Games?**

During the morning large group recreation time, students will be assigned to a team for a time of fun and team building. These teams will be organized in a way that incorporates a balance of ages and genders from all three campuses. We do this so students can have the opportunity to meet others they normally might not start a conversation with. Students may not be placed with their best friend, and that's ok. The schedule allows plenty of time to be with your friends [meals, AM/PM Sessions, cabins, and free time].

### **Who is taking care of my student?**

Camp is led by experienced DC Students staff, along with a group of trained volunteers who are passionate about students. Most adult volunteers are currently serving as mentors and leaders in DC Students. All adults have completed an interview process and background check.

Safety is our first priority, therefore the week will be staffed with experienced lifeguards, registered nurses, and a nightly Security team.

### **What if my student has medication?**

When checking in, parents of students with medication are required to meet with the camp nurse. All prescription medication must be in their original containers **[not generic bags or bottles]**. You will have the opportunity to give instructions to the nurse and ask any questions you may have. Have all instructions typed out to help ensure exactly what your child needs and when they need it.

### **What's the dress code?**

#### Team Building:

- Athletic clothing that you don't mind getting dirty/messy/or thrown away.
- Outfits that reveal mid-drift, cleavage or underwear are not permitted. Boys are expected to wear shirts at all times except at the pool

#### Swimsuits:

- Girl's one-piece suit or two-piece w/tank top. Tankinis are acceptable.
- Guy's must wear appropriate swim trunks; no cutoff jeans/shorts, no speedos

#### Throughout the day and Worship:

- Casual Dress. It's summer...in Florida. Pack clothes that protect you from the sun and keep you cool.
- Clothing that is too tight, revealing, or causes disruption is inappropriate.
- Gang paraphernalia, garments and/or jewelry, tattoos, or other insignias, which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording/graphics or may tend to provoke violence or disruption at camp shall not be worn.
- Hemlines of shorts, dresses, skirts, and skorts shall be no shorter than mid-thigh.
- Clothing must be 3 inches at the shoulder.

**Note:** Parents, if clothing is questionable, we may ask students to change. Please help students pack accordingly. *(See Packing List)*

### **What are the sleeping arrangements like?**

Lake Yale Convention Center offers cabin style room that consist of 26 bunkbed style beds with Leader rooms in the middle. Bathrooms and showers are located in each cabin. Each student has their own twin size bed and is responsible for providing their own bedding (sleeping bag or sheets/blanket, and pillow).

All boys will be located at the North Campus Cabins and then divided into Middle School and High School cabins.

All girls will be located at the South Campus Cabins and then divided into Middle School and High School cabins.

**Will I get to a room with my friends?**

Yes. We organize cabins by campus and small groups [age/gender]. Our goal is for you to be where your friends are [and meet some new ones].

**What are my students eating?**

Lake Yale Convention Center provides 3 complete meals a day. The Snack Shack will be available in the afternoon and evening, serving chips, candy, drinks, and ice cream. Items are typically \$1, so plan to pack spending money as needed.

**What if my student has dietary restrictions?**

Special meal plans are available. If your student has dietary needs, please indicate specifics on the registration form.
